STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

You have the right to cancel this Enrollment Agreement for a course of instruction and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have the right to receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled course instruction in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance.

The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with postage prepaid.

If you cancel this Agreement, the School will refund any money that you paid, less a cancellation processing fee not to exceed \$250, and less any deduction for equipment not timely returned in good condition, within thirty days after your Notice of Cancellation is received.
